NRW Education Scholarship Application Form

The Northeast Republican Women's Education Scholarship was established to honor and remember NRW members who made a significant impact on their communities as advocates, conservatives, and patriots.

Eligibility Requirements:

- a. Must be a woman, 18 years of age or older.
- b. Must be a US citizen, registered and active Republican voter.
- c. Must reside in Hamilton, Warren, Clermont or Butler County.
- d. Applicant must be pursuing an Associate, Undergraduate or Graduate degree at an accredited college or university in Ohio.
- e. Applicant must demonstrate good citizenship, which may include participation in a variety of community service activities, volunteerism, etc.
- f. Applicant must maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.0 or equal to or above the school average.
- g. Preferred areas of study include social sciences; other areas of study are eligible and will be considered.
- h. This \$1,000 scholarship is granted for a one-year period; previous scholarship recipients may reapply if grade point average and citizenship criteria described above are maintained.
- I. Scholarship recipients who fail to maintain the requisite grade point average and citizenship criteria will be ineligible for future grants from the Scholarship Fund.
- j. Disbursements from the Scholarship Fund will be issued directly to the applicant's educational institution.
- k. Winning students agree to attend an NRW meeting to be awarded the scholarship. Applicants must give written approval to the NRW Club to use their name and photo for NRW scholarship promotions.

As part of our application process, we ask applicants to disclose any past criminal convictions or pending charges. Please note that disclosure of a criminal history will not automatically disqualify you from consideration; each case will be reviewed individually. Please provide details of any past convictions or pending charges.

Essay:

Provide a typed essay (500-800 words; 1-2 pages). Choose from a combination, or 1 of the following essay prompts:

Draw from personal anecdotes, observations, and reflections to illustrate your understanding and appreciation of conservative values. Your essay should provide concrete examples that demonstrate your dedication to these principles and showcase how they have influenced your actions, decisions, and aspirations.

- 1. Personal Responsibility: Describe a situation in which you took personal responsibility for a challenge or obstacle in your life. How did you demonstrate resilience, determination, and accountability in overcoming this challenge? How does this experience reflect your understanding of the importance of personal responsibility in achieving success?
- 2. Individual Liberty: Discuss a time when you advocated for individual freedom or defended the rights of others. What motivated you to take a stand for liberty and autonomy? How do you balance the pursuit of individual freedom with respect for the rule of law and the rights of others in society?
- 3. Community Engagement: Describe a volunteer or service experience in which you actively participated in your community. How did your involvement contribute to the well-being and resilience of your community? How do conservative values, such as charity, compassion, and civic duty, guide your commitment to serving others?

Video:

Please submit a video (3 minutes or less) of yourself and why you are applying for this scholarship. Email, or include the path to your video on YouTube, X, Rumble, or platform of your choice.
